percent, yet fewer than half of cyclists wear one when they ride. The Texas Academy of Family Physicians (TAFP) provided funding for this giveaway. TAFP's support helps family physicians encourage health and safety in more communities across Texas through Hard Hats for Little Heads.

Since TMA's Hard Hats for Little Heads program began, TMA has given away more than 325,000 helmets to Texas children. Hard Hats for Little Heads is supported in 2019 with a TMA Foundation grant thanks to its Legacy of Caring and General Endowments, and generous gifts from an anonymous physician and spouse and donors to TMAF's Make-A-Difference and Greatest Need appeals.

The OGH Board of Directors has taken a giant step to move this process forward at this time with an incredible medical staff and expanding services with two physicians returning home with their families to serve their community. The OGH Healthcare Foundation has also been established to receive charitable gifts to maintain and expand medical services. I am also pleased to share that OGH staff members were the first group to make campaign pledges. The OGH Capital Campaign Committee – chaired by Brent Allen and Mary Betty – is moving forward with the Close to Home plan. We are almost to \$2,000,000.00 in cash and pledges with \$1,729,195.00 raised.

We have a pledge commitment to match funds and have plans to reach the \$5,000,000.00 mark with local and area grants. This will put OGH in a position to qualify for state and national healthcare grants to meet the campaign goal. We hope everyone in Ochiltree County will make a gift or pledge of any amount that meets their personal needs in 2019. Pledges may be paid over a 3-year period.

We look forward to working with families and corporations in sharing their gifts to create an incredible facility here at home. We will hold a community meeting in early Fall to update everyone on our progress in making our new hometown facility a reality.

The Northwest Texas Hospital Association established the scholarship program in order to assist smaller communities in the state in their efforts to recruit health care professionals to work in rural hospitals. The Association awarded a total of \$10,000.00 this year to students nominated by member hospitals. Each hospital provides the matching scholarship amount for a total of \$500.00 per student. The Northwest Texas Hospital Association is the oldest association of its kind in the state and is composed of hospitals, businesses and others interested in health care and continuing access to health care. The membership territory covers the area from the Panhandle in the North, to Dallas in the East, El Paso in the West and Kerrville in the South. 🥟
